# What is a Zine?



#### Q: What are zines?

A: Zines are niche, handmade, hyper-local booklets created by community members for community members. Anyone with access to a copy machine or printer can create a zine, making this format more accessible than traditional publishing channels for quickly spreading ideas.

#### Q: Who are zines for?

A: Zines are for everyone. If there's a topic you want to read about, it's likely that someone has made a zine about it. Zines may be highly informative, filled with writing or art, or written in a comic format. Zines often represent marginalized and alternative viewpoints not found in mainstream publishing, so they may appeal to those interested in new and different ideas. Because of their handmade construction, they often crossover into works of art.

### The Nebraska Legislature is in Session!

In light of recent national events it can be challenging to stay on ways to take action that are within our control here in Nebraska.

Nebraska has a unique nonpartisan Unicameral system that can be a powerful force for everyday people to take action in their own government. We are the second house!

If you are new to following, there are resources available to help you stay on top of important updates and action items via the Nebraska Legislative Study Group.









The Nebraska Unicameral gives Nebraska residents an opportunity to uniquely participate in our state government and develop relationships with our state legislators. As the country's only Unicameral, Nebraskans act as the state's 2nd House. As the 2nd House, we hold both the right and responsibility to participate in public hearings on legislation introduced each year. The following document is meant to help guide Nebraskans through this process.

#### SUBMIT ONLINE COMMENT - NEBRASKA LEGISLATURE

#### Step 1: Go to www.nebraskalegislature.gov


#### Step 2: Use the bill search to locate the bill.



#### Step 3: Click on "Submit Comments Online For LBXXX".



#### Step 4: Read the Written Submission Pop-Up and select "I Understand".



Step 5: Mark whether or not you would like your comment to be a part of the Public Hearing Record and fill out your personal information including your First and Last Name, your complete ADDRESS, and your email. You will use this email to verify your comment and complete the process so be sure you enter an email you can access.

Comments for Public Hearing Record must be submitted by 8:00 AM CT the day of the Hearing.

Step 6: Checkmark if you are representing yourself or someone else and if you are a Proponent (Support), Opponent (Oppose), or Neutral on the bill.

Step 7: Complete your Written Statement. There is a limit of 500 words. NELSG also recommends copying and pasting your comments in an email to your state senator. You can find your state senator and their email address/contact information at <a href="mailto:nebraskalegislature.gov/senators/senator\_find.php">nebraskalegislature.gov/senators/senator\_find.php</a>

Written Statement

Enter your written comment. There is a limit of 500 words. If copying and pasting from another source, please paste as plain text. On Windows, right mouse click and select Paste as Plain Text or by holding CTRL and Shift and then pressing vion your keyboard. On a Mac, right mouse click and select Paste and Match Style or by holding Command and Shift and then pressing vion your keyboard.

Step 8: Checkmark the reCAPTCHA box and Click "Submit Online Comment".



Step 9: Go to your Email and click on the link to verify your comment. Your testimony will NOT be submitted until you complete this step.
